



Calumet Heritage Area and National Designation Initiative

The Calumet Heritage Area is a place of nationally significant natural, industrial, labor, and cultural heritage assets that are preserved and interpreted to advance opportunity, and enrich the lives of its residents and visitors from across the nation.

The Calumet Heritage Area (CHA) strives to bring people together across the bi-state region to conserve natural and cultural heritage, improve recreational opportunities, promote regional arts, support sustainable economic development, and create heritage-oriented educational programming. The Calumet Heritage Partnership began this effort and is working in partnership with the Calumet Collaborative, a bi-state organization focused on sustainable development, and the Field Museum, to create and manage the CHA. These partners lead the initiative to designate this unique region as a Calumet National Heritage Area. They have enlisted the help of numerous local historical societies, environmental organizations, arts organizations, planning agencies, companies, and citizens to make the current heritage area a reality.

Key Activities

Annual Calumet Heritage Conference

Twenty-one years running, the Calumet Heritage Partnership presents the Calumet Heritage Conference each fall. The unique format traditionally includes discussion in the morning and an afternoon field excursion. Themes have included Art and Heritage: The Making of the Calumet, Celebrating and Restoring the Calumet's Living Landscape, and this year's theme of Calumet Voices/National Stories. <http://calumetheritage.org/conference/conference.html>

National Heritage Area Management Planning Process

In partnership with focus area committees of regional experts, the Calumet National Heritage Area (CNHA) Coordinating Committee developed and prioritized a compelling set of actionable projects where the CNHA could best be leveraged to make a difference in the region. These projects, based on priorities identified in the Calumet National Heritage Area Feasibility Study, aimed at strengthening partnerships, forging new ways of working across the region, enriching capacity for community efforts, regional identity and connectivity, and shining a national spotlight on local stories. Calumet National Heritage Area Feasibility Study

The revised version of the Calumet National Heritage Area Feasibility Study was submitted to the National Park Service (NPS) in April 2018, and received NPS approval later that year. The revision includes changes made based on suggestions from the NPS, as well as a summary of public comments received on the draft study, a response to the comments, and 79 letters of support. <http://calumetheritage.org/cnhastudy.html>.
